The Post Office (Reserved Postal Services) Order, 2010

Coming into operation

14 September 2010

THE DIRECTOR GENERAL, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by section 9 of the Post Office (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Law, 2001^a and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby orders:-

Designation of reserved postal services.

1. Postal services are designated as reserved postal services, where those services:

- (1) are provided in consideration of a payment of less than £1.35 made by or on behalf of the person to whom those services are provided;
or
- (2) are postal items which have a length equal to or less than 353mm and a width equal to or less than 250mm and a thickness equal to or less than 25mm and a weight equal to or less than 750g.

Interpretation.

2. (1) Words and expressions in this Order shall, unless the context requires otherwise, have the same meaning as in the Post Office (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Law, 2001, as the same may from time to time be amended.

(2) The Interpretation (Guernsey) Law, 1948^b shall apply to the interpretation of this Order.

Revocation of S.I. No. 37 of 2001.

3. The Post Office (Reserved Postal Services) Order, 2001, registered as Guernsey Statutory Instrument No. 37 of 2001 and signed by R. Finn as Director General of Utilities Regulation on 1 October 2001, is revoked.

Citation and commencement.

4. This Order may be cited as the Post Office (Reserved Postal Services) Order, 2010 and shall come into force on the 14 September 2010.

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

(This note is not part of the Order)

This Order designates as reserved postal services, those postal services which are provided for a consideration of less than £1.35 and postal services relating to postal items subject to the restrictions set out in this Order. Under the Post Office

(Bailiwick of Guernsey) Law, 2001 postal services which are not reserved postal services may lawfully be provided without a licence from the Director General of Utilities Regulation. This Order revokes the Post Office (Reserved Postal Services) Order, 2001.
